### **Freedom School Update**

Rainbow Mennonite Freedom School enrollment went quicker this year than ever before! We have filled 100 slots and already have 18 children on the waiting list. Freedom School is clearly meeting a need in the community.

The Sharing Community in Rosedale is launching an Individual Giving Campaign to support Freedom School this summer. The goal is to raise \$25,000. The 2014 budget for the school is \$100,457, and 81% of that amount has been raised to date. Your individual gift will help us meet budget and begin to replenish reserves. Persons are encouraged to make checks payable to Sharing Community in Rosedale, but they can also be made out to Rainbow Mennonite Church and designated for Freedom School. One parent observed that her daughter developed more self-confidence after coming to Freedom School last summer. She previously was very shy, but then after Freedom School she opened up and no longer stumbled over words when reading out loud. This family lives at Rosedale Ridge, which is the low-income housing complex at the top of Mill St. hill.

***Spring Adult Education Classes***

**David and Goliath.....Wesley Room**

This class is a discussion of the book *David and Goliath: Underdogs, Misfits, and the Art of Battling Giants* by Malcolm Gladwell. With a “use what you got” attitude, Gladwell is able to move through history highlighting figures such as Lawrence of Arabia and Martin Luther King Jr, Gladwell shows the “underdogs” prevail.

**The Nonviolent God.....Room 110**

This class is a discussion of the book *The Nonviolent God* by Dr. J. Denny Weaver. *The Nonviolent God* explores the positive images that the narrative of Jesus has on Christian living, including nonviolent practices, forgiveness and restorative justice, issues of racism and sexism, and more.

**State of Wonder.....Sunflower Room**

This class is a discussion of the book *State of Wonder* by Ann Patchett, a novel that follows pharmaceutical researcher Dr. Marina Singh through her journey into the Amazon jungle. This novel is emotional, vivid, and a work of literature that will resonate with readers in the weeks and months to come.

**The Wired Word.....Library**

This modern Bible study uses headlines to illustrate each week's adult lesson. Each Thursday, lessons are emailed to the facilitators with the scriptural texts and questions for discussion. Lesson materials will be emailed each week.
