The topic of the **Next Chapter KC** May 21 forum is “Downsizing Your Stuff – Clutter vs. Keepers.” The forum will be held here at Rainbow Mennonite in the fellowship hall from 6 to 7:30 p.m. It's possible that having too much stuff requires personal energy that could be freed to take on new learning, goals, and passions in our lives after leaving our primary careers. The focus will be on how to reduce our stuff, to learn about practical ways of tackling the situation, and also to understand and deal with the emotional factors that may make this particularly challenging. Our presenters will be Chiquita Miller, PhD, CFLE, with K-State Research and Extension, and Nancy Luber, LCSW, with Mental Health Specialists in Aging. Freedom School Update

The Sharing Community in Rosedale is launching an Individual Giving Campaign to support Freedom School this summer. The 2015 budget for the school is \$109,846. The majority of our funding will be given on a reimbursement basis, so we need funds to help us operate until we are reimbursed. The goal is to raise \$20,000.

Persons are encouraged to make checks payable to Sharing Community in Rosedale, but they can also be made out to Rainbow Mennonite Church and designated for Freedom School. Feel free to talk with Rachel Hostetler with questions or for more information.

Freedom School Story:

Scholars who participate in Rainbow Freedom School are expected to either maintain or improve their reading levels. Parents have observed this and the research backs it up as well. In 2014, our site participated in the Children’s Defense Fund national assessment of the Freedom Schools program. On average, the 28 children tested demonstrated a 1-year and 1-month of increase in their instructional reading level. In addition, 91% of the children tested maintained or gained in instructional reading level and did not experience summer learning loss.

Today, May 17, many people around the world are commemorating the World Health Organization's decision on May 17, 1990 to declassify homosexuality as a mental disorder. The IDAHOT (<http://dayagainsthomophobia.org>) organization has encouraged churches worldwide to mark this day in prayer. Therefore the following prayer will be offering during today's worship service: *We give thanks for the sacredness of humanity. We uphold our call to witness and respond to human suffering and brokenness. We must not keep silent when lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer people face persecution or discrimination. We lament that people experience injustice, in our communities and across the globe, based simply on whom they choose to love or how they acknowledge their gender identity. Rooted in awareness, we pray for healing. Anchored in humility, we work for peace and justice. Guided by love, we hope for a world where all people are celebrated and loved, where their rights are secured, and where their sexual and gender diversity is valued. Amen.*
