Brown uses Robeson's own words from his autobiography "Here I Stand" and comments from legendary peace activist and artist Pete Seeger to trace his humble beginnings as a preacher's son in Princeton, N.J., to his international celebrity and pioneering activism on the world stage. There is no admission charge.
