#### **Freedom School Update**

The Sharing Community in Rosedale is launching an Individual Giving Campaign to support Freedom School this summer. Your individual gift will help us meet budget and begin to replenish reserves. Persons are encouraged to make checks payable to Sharing Community in Rosedale, but they can also be made out to Rainbow Mennonite Church and designated for Freedom School. ### Freedom School Story:

Scholars who participate in Rainbow Freedom School are expected to either maintain or improve their reading levels. Parents have observed this and the research backs it up as well. In 2013, our site participated in the CDF national assessment of the Freedom Schools program. Forty-seven children from our site demonstrated a 11-month increase in instructional reading level. And most children (85.1%) maintained or gained in instructional reading level and did not experience summer learning loss.

# Spring Adult Education Classes

David and Goliath......Wesley Room

This class is a discussion of the book *David and Goliath: Underdogs, Misfits, and the Art of Battling Giants* by Malcolm Gladwell. With a "use what you got" attitude, Gladwell is able to move through history highlighting figures such as Lawrence of Arabia and Martin Luther King Jr, Gladwell shows the "underdogs" prevail.

The Nonviolent God......Room 110

This class is a discussion of the book *The Nonviolent God* by Dr. J. Denny Weaver. *The Nonviolent God* explores the positive images that the narrative of Jesus has on Christian living, including nonviolent practices, forgiveness and restorative justice, issues of racism and sexism, and more.

State of Wonder.....Sunflower Room

This class is a discussion of the book *State of Wonder* by Ann Patchett, a novel that follows pharmaceutical researcher Dr. Marina Singh through her journey into the Amazon jungle. This novel is emotional, vivid, and a work of literature that will resonate with readers in the weeks and months to come.

This modern Bible study uses headlines to illustrate each week's adult lesson. Each Thursday, lessons are emailed to the facilitators with the scriptural texts and questions for discussion. Lesson materials will be emailed each week.
