Rosedale Ridge Update

Many changes are happening at Rosedale Ridge. Rosedale Ridge recently failed their HUD inspection and consequently lost their contract with HUD. This means they can no longer accept HUD subsidies. There has also been a change in the management company, but their rental license remains revoked by the city. This is happening because of the poor conditions of the apartments. As a result, all Rosedale Ridge residents will be relocated in the coming months, and current residents are being assessed for housing vouchers.

On Monday, April 13, our church hosted a meeting for all Rosedale Ridge residents. Representatives from HUD and the city provided information about the relocation process and answered residents' questions. There will likely be additional meetings at the church to keep residents informed.
