Readings in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

God comes into the picture even when the Church won't take a stand. God has injected a principle into this universe. God has said that all [people] must respect the dignity and worth of all human personality, "And you don't do that, I will take charge!" It seems this morning that I can hear God speaking. I can hear [God] speaking throughout the universe saying, "Be still and know that I am God. And you don't stop, if you don't straighten up, if you don't stop exploiting people, I'm going to rise up and break the backbone of your power. And your power will be no more!

-Excerpt from The Birth of a New Nation, sermon delivered by Dr. King at Dexter Avenue Baptist Church on April 7, 1957

[The] call for a world-wide fellowship that lifts neighborly concern beyond one's tribe, race, class and nation is in reality a call for an all-embracing and unconditional love for all [people]. This oft misunderstood and misinterpreted concept – so readily dismissed by the Nietzsches of the world as a weak and cowardly force – has now become an absolute necessity for the survival of [humanity]. When I speak of love I am not speaking of some sentimental and weak response. I am speaking of that force which all of the great religions have seen as the supreme unifying principle of life. Love is somehow the key that unlocks the door which leads to ultimate reality. This Hindu-Moslem-Christian-Jewish-Buddhist belief about ultimate reality is beautifully summed up in the first epistle of Saint John:

Let us love one another; for love is God and everyone that loveth is born of God and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us.
