UNITY is an interactive public art project and its larger-than-life structure helps us celebrate our uniqueness and strengthens our ties to each other. The project consists of 32 posts, each with identifiers such as, "I'm a parent; I speak English as a second language; I'm a cat person," etc. Participants tie colorful yarn to posts that reflect their identities. Their yarn intertwines with others to create a web of interconnectedness. In the end, we see that we are all connected by something, and it's our diversity that builds a strong and vibrant community. The Unity Project began at the Whitmore Jubilee last evening.

Next Sunday we will begin a new summer worship series on the Psalms.
