**Chilean poet, Pablo Neruda, was born in 1904 and died in 1973. Among his many books were four volumes of odes to ordinary objects and substances, everyday experiences, animals and plants, the seasons, celestial bodies, geological regions and cities, emotions, friends and people he admired. His poetry examines these ordinary things with love, care and attention. Neruda was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1971. One of Neruda's fans, John McCutcheon, put these poems to song in his 2010 album *Mightier than the Sword*.
