### This Morning at Rainbow

Dr. Drew Hart is a professor at Messiah College and well known theologian, blogger, activist, and author of <u>Trouble I've Seen: Changing the Way the Church Views Racism</u>, a book that utilizes everyday stories, Jesus-shaped theological ethics, and anti-racism frameworks in hopes of transforming the church's understanding and witness in society.
