Staff Updates

Ben Parker Sutter is out of the office through June 13 while attending a seminary course with Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary. This course is a nine-day pilgrimage that traces the route of the 1838 forced removal by the U.S. military of 850 Potawatomi people from their ancestral homeland in northern Indiana to present-day Osawatomie, KS. Ben will remember this Trail of Death expulsion by prayerfully walking several miles of the route each day and by reading journals and letters from the time of the removal.

Rosi Penner Kaufman will be gone June 10-16, assisting with a class on worship and music at Brite Theological Seminary at Texas Christian University.
