The **Rainbow Piecemakers** would like to assist the MCC comforter project which sends comforters to refugee camps. As you may have seen in prior news notes, they have amassed 800 comforters that need finished. We would like to do a Comforter Blitz - that is, spend a day with at least 4 frames constantly being used, knotting as many comforters as we can.

October 26, Tuesday, the Rainbow Piecemakers would like to invite anyone in the congregation, men, women, children, plus friends and neighbors to join us for our own Comforter Blitz. We will be prepared to teach anyone who comes, all you need is willingness to hold a needle and tie knots, no skill or experience needed! You can come for a couple minutes, an hour or however long, we will start at 10 and plan to finish around 4. We are hoping to get at least 20 knotted in that time period.

We will be following the Rainbow Covid Committee guidelines, which include vaccinated people only, masks, fans for air circulation in Fellowship Hall, brown bag lunch eaten outdoors. We will provide more specific guidelines the Sunday before.
