About the sculpture at the front of the sanctuary:

As a summer teen Sunday School project during the 1980's, this collaboration between Rainbow member Arlie Regier, Rainbow students and neighbors took place both indoors and outdoors. Designs of religious meaning were drawn on paper and then cut out to be fitted together. Eventually the group moved outside to the park where the paper patterns were used as templates to cut sheets of steel with everyone's participation. Students plus neighbors, all with goggles on, watched as Arlie welded the pieces together into the sculpture. It was allowed to rust and the piece was finished with a clear top coat. Arlie remembered this experience as "one summer when rough edges and fire somehow came together for a few young people of 'The Book'."
